Call for Papers

We invite paper submissions from all major subjects of economics, finance, computer science, and politics relevant to mechanisms and institutions, including but not limited to, micro, macro, econometrics, labor, mechanism/market design, game theory, growth, economic history, monetary economics, experimental economics, financial economics, trade, and political economics. Papers can be theoretical, empirical, experimental, historical, practical, or simply clever. Young economists including final year PhD students are encouraged to submit their papers.

As far as technically possible, all conference talks will be streamed live and made available to registered participants free of charge. There are no registration or participation fees, but we welcome voluntary donations to help cover costs.
